# PSAs r US

**Public service announcements are a way for non-profits to get their message out**

Have you ever heard an announcement on KRCL about a benefit concert, a lecture coming up, or a special art class being offered to the public? Maybe you've heard about a health screening, or a museum exhibit, or a volunteer opportunity. Those are public service announcements, also called PSAs, and KRCL airs tens of thousands of them every year. They are another service KRCL offers to the community, disseminating information about events and services from non-profit organizations around our broadcast area.

If you'd like to submit information for a PSA, here's how to do it. Send the fol-

lowing information to [psa@krcl.org](mailto:psa@krcl.org): details about the event or service, including relevant dates, times, and places; the name of the sponsoring organization; and a name and telephone number to contact for more information. If you'd like, you can also include an email contact or a website address. Please be aware that, since we're licensed as a non-commercial, non-profit, radio station, we cannot air commercial messages, advertisements for businesses, or messages about individual political candidates, and we reserve the right to edit for length, content, or appropriateness.

Program hosts select PSAs to read, based

on the interests of their audiences and the timeliness of the event. If you'd like to have your PSA read during a particular program, you can contact Kami St. John, KRCL's Development Director, at 363-1818 for more information on scheduling a paid public service announcement.

# Public Affairs Shows Now on the Web

**KRCL now archives many of its public affairs shows, so you won't miss a thing!**

Did you miss your favorite public affairs (sometimes called PA) show? We now have an archive on the KRCL web page where you can download recent PA shows and listen to them from the privacy of your own computer.

KRCL goes out into the community and interviews the most interesting people in Salt Lake City. Sometimes these people are the heads of organizations or are covered in the mainstream press, but often our hosts interview people that would be considered too "ordinary" for an interview in this day and age of "sensational press". But isn't ordinary interesting? I think so. Because every person has a story to tell.

You also get other interesting things with

KRCL's local public affairs shows. You get a full half hour of information. No 6-second sound bites or 5-minute news pieces. How can you understand complex issues in 5 minutes? Well, it's our feeling that you can't. But in a half hour you can go beyond the surface to find the nuance and intrigue that is left out of news stories made for mass consumption.

A word or two about the Logan translator and webcasting is

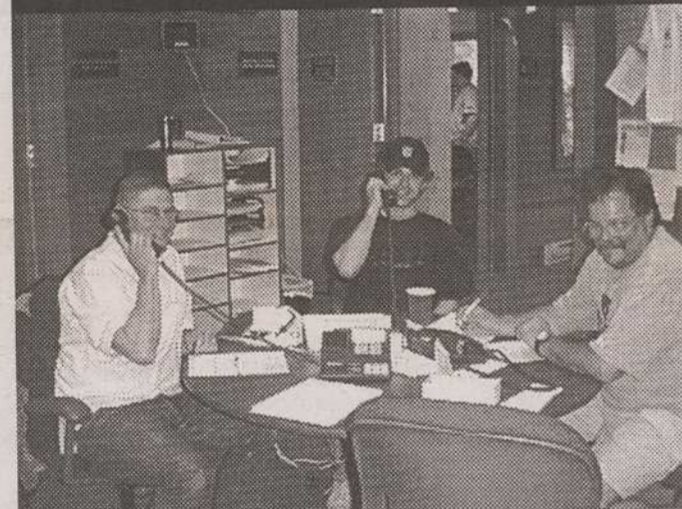

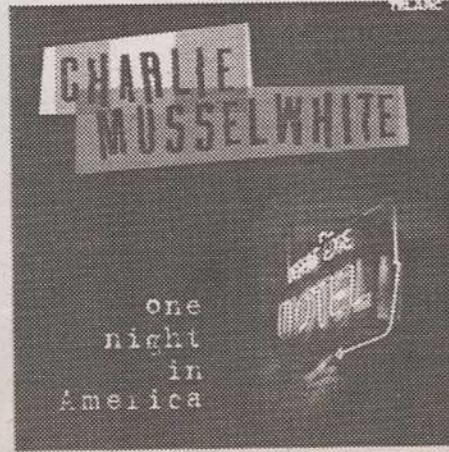

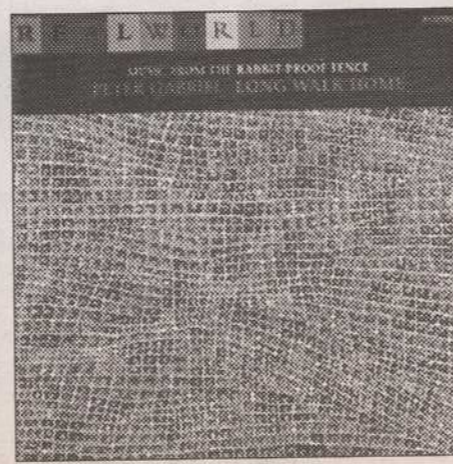

### KRCL Recognized in "Best Of" City Weekly Awards

KRCL recently received some pretty impressive awards from the City Weekly's "Best of Utah" poll. City Weekly is the area's weekly entertainment and independent news magazine. They do these "Best of" polls of their readers once a year, and this year, KRCL shone. KRCL took second place for "Best Radio Station in Salt Lake City", as well as several other awards.

"Saturday Sagebrush Serenade" hosted by John Florence, was named the "Best Boomer Radio Show". Here is some of what City Weekly had to say about the program and host: "Where else can you embark on a quest to identify the Top 10 rock & roll tunes of all time? ## Local and touring musicians eagerly gain access to airwaves at KRCL

KRCL has long prided itself on providing a forum for local music. But lately, we've been taking that a step further by providing a forum for local music played live. There are now several opportunities every month to hear local artists bringing their music to you direct from the KRCL studios. (We even have a CD of performances recorded in KRCL's studios, called "KRCL Live", available during radiothons.)

On the second Wednesday of every month, **Aural Decay** (Wednesdays 8 - 10:30 pm) brings you an hour of local live music, starting at 9 pm. Recent guests have included **The Stacey Board Band**, **Jerry Joseph and the Jackmormons**, **The Gigi Love Band**, and **Up Yer Sleeve**, among others. Coming up next will be **J.W. Blackout** on June 12.

If you like that high lonesome sound, tune in on the second Sunday of every odd month from 2 - 5 pm as the **Bluegrass Express** features live bluegrass music. **Ridin' the Fault Line** and **Buyin' Time** have appeared recently, and **Gift Horse** and **The Stormy Mountain Boys** will both be making appearances this summer and fall.

In addition to featuring local musicians, many KRCL hosts interview artists travelling through the area or performing locally, and encourage them to play a song or two while they're at KRCL's studios. You're probably most likely to hear those performers on one of the **Drive Time** shows (3 - 6 pm weekdays), but you might also hear them on the **Breakfast Jams** (6 - 9 am Monday through Friday, and 7 - 10 am on Saturdays), on **Circle of Life** (Sundays 7 - 10 am), or on **Global Gumbo** (1 - 3 pm Monday through Thursday). Of course, there's the **Blue Goat Feature Edition**, broadcasting live national blues acts from the **Dead Goat Saloon** at 9:30 pm on the last Monday of every month. And on occasion performers will turn up on other shows as well - you'll just have to keep it tuned to KRCL to catch them.
