I went to college outside of New York City and was lucky enough to be near WNEW a great commercial progressive station (at least it was then), which introduced me to the Clash, Joe Jackson and Elvis Costello. Of course, living in New Jersey I was federally mandated to appreciate Bruce Springsteen. By the time I got to Texas, I found most radio wasn't like what I'd been listening to in the Northeast. Most of the great music wasn't played on the radio. However, Pacifica's KPFT in Houston was a huge exception. They played Rock, Reggae, Folk, World, Blues you name it. Spun by disk jockeys that knew the music, not radio personalities. So after an ill-advised move to Nebraska I came back to Houston and volunteered for the station. Since then I've spent time back in Philadelphia as well as in Dallas, but now I'm here in Salt Lake with a great resource in KRCL.

I'm delighted to be able to volunteer my time to such a great station, and I hope people continue to enjoy Tuesday Breakfast Jam with me as the host. Don't forget to call with requests because this is YOUR community radio station.

Just the facts: I was born (1965) and raised in Salt Lake City, attended Olympus High School, Utah State University and graduated from the University of Utah with a degree in Telecommunications and Film. I have a wonderful wife, Annie, and a 2 year old little boy, Ian. I enjoy golfing, open ocean sailing the Utes, the Yankees and the Eagles.

Now the filling: I started collecting records when I was 4. It started with Yellow Submarine and was followed very closely by ABC by the Jackson Five (which is still one of my favorites). After being discharged from the Coast Guard (New York, Washington D.C., Miami, Brownsville, Los Angeles and Alaska). I returned to Salt Lake, graduated from the U and found a job working the door for the Ashbury Pub. After a few years and too many beers at the bar I worked awhile at a respectable job and met/married my wife who after seeing a stack of CDs I had just purchased made the comment that I should just buy the whole damn store; she wasn't serious, but I thought it sounded like a great idea. I quit my job, emptied our savings and bought Salt City CDs, which is now Orion's Music of Salt Lake.

I love this community, and I love KRCL. It has been a wonderful opportunity to be able to give back to both and I hope everyone enjoys the show. It has been difficult stepping into a legend like Earl B.s time slot but it has been fun and while the music is roughly the same I hope people are enjoying the slow change from disco to soul.
