### A Night with Amy Goodman



As part of their 70 city book tour, Amy Goodman, host of Democracy Now!, along with her brother David Goodman, came to Salt Lake City to promote their new book **The Exception to the Rule: Exposing Oily Politicians, War Profiteers, and the Media that Love Them** and celebrate 25 Years of KRCL. This being their first trip to Salt Lake, Amy and David did not have time for any relaxation. Upon arrival to the station Amy made a few quick calls, spent time recording station ID's and went on-air with Teri, host of Wednesday Drive Time; she was then whisked off to the Art Barn for a private KRCL reception. Once there Amy went on air via telephone with KRCB TV and Radio (Rohnert Park, CA) and spent time signing books while being interviewed. Once the reception started, she spoke to guests while personalizing their autographed copy of **The Exception to the Rule**. Later, at Libby Gardner Hall, she spoke to an overflowing audience of nearly 1,000 enthusiastic individuals wanting to hear what she and David had to say.

The evening program began with the showing of the DVD, *Independent Media in a Time of War* highlighting the need for independent media "to go where the silence is and represent the voices of people engaged in dissent." Following the DVD presentation David read several excerpts from their book and then introduced his sister to an anxious crowd. Amy spent the remaining time speaking about the early days of Pacifica Radio, her trip to East Timor in the early 90's where she nearly died, and September 11 around the world and throughout history. . . Once finished, the crowd filed out of Libby Gardner Hall with varying emotions; many expressing gratitude to KRCL for airing Democracy Now! The evening came to an end at 9:30 when Amy and David rushed to catch their flight back to Colorado, where they would begin a new day similar to the one before.

### Loud and Clear Attends the 6th Annual National Youth in Radio Training Project Conference



On April 21 the eight members of Loud and Clear, KRCL and Spy Hop Production's all-youth radio team, packed up their minidisc recorders, mics, and headphones and headed to Albuquerque, New Mexico! Having raised over \$900.00 from the Battle of the Bands, received around \$1,000.00 in scholarship from the National Youth Radio Training Project Conference, and \$800.00 in scholarship from KRCL 90.9 and Spy Hop Productions, the group was ready to fine tune their skills and share their work!

At the Hyatt Regency, the talented team joined over 150 youth radio producers and their adult project directors from around the country, engaging in two days of intensive radio workshops, listening sessions, and hands-on experience. While some students delved into finding their radio personality and media literacy, others tried on the quick pace of radio journalism as they, in less than 8 hours, attended The Gathering of Nations-the largest powwow in North America and created a finished new piece ready to air! Still others were able to set up partnerships for future collaborations; allowing for Loud and Clear's documentaries to be played across the country, from Blunt/Youth Radio Project in Portland, Maine to Youth Radio in Berkeley, California!

Upon, arriving home on April 25th, the Loud and Clear team felt, yes a little tired, but more so, confident in their place in the landscape of youth radio and more than ready to try on their new skills.
