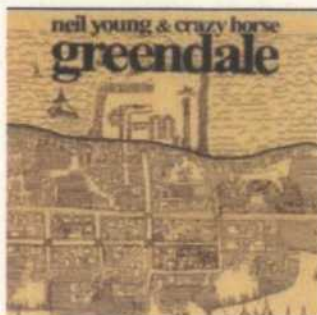
KRCL Broadcasting LIVE from Utah Arts Festival

25 Years with KRCL

He came west and went to the University of Utah; one quarter he even took skiing, much to his father's dismay. And then he discovered KRCL. He says it was something that "made you feel like you were part of an established underground network that the mainstream population didn't really know about. If you knew about it you were really on the inside, whether you were a listener or at the station behind the scenes; you were part of an alternative club."

He started out on KRCL on Monday mornings, 9 - noon, co-hosting Monday Morning Mass ("If you miss Sunday's mass, you can attend Monday Morning Mass."). From there he went to Wednesday nights, bringing KRCL listeners Aural Decay and Wednesday Night Live before taking over the helm on Saturday Sagebrush Serenade. "Radio continues to be fascinating," he says, and he contends that he's changed over the years on air. He feels he's become more bold, and is talking more about politics and current events - "maybe that's a sign of the times," he says. He talks about doing his show the night after 9-11 happened, saying, "It was really hard to do. But I started recollecting things about New York City from when I lived there, and that reminded me of good times in the city, like Simon and Garfunkel's Concert in Central Park. I picked a lot of songs that related to New York City in particular and put those on the air, and talked about my memories and experiences of really great times in that city."

He continues, "That's what I think is the difference between what KRCL does and commercial stations do: the songs that we play have meaning to them - not just to the songwriter, not just to the listener, but also to the person who puts them on the air. KRCL is part of your life, and you become part of the show as the listener. It's not just this machine that cranks out sound; radio requires you to use a part of your brain you don't use while you're watching TV. Radio is a very powerful thing."

You may have caught Dave broadcasting live from the Living Traditions festival or Day in the Park; you can also catch up with him broadcasting live from the grounds of the Utah Arts Festival this summer. And of course, tune in for Saturday Sage from 10 am to 1 pm every Saturday on KRCL.
