Babs Delay

Babs initially did a drive-time rap show, playing lots of bands like Run DMC. But after garnering ninety-six marriage proposals from guys at the prison in just two years, she decided it was time for a change, and began hosting a women's music show called "Face the Music". Eventually that show morphed into "Women the Second Decade", which in time became "Women the Third Decade", the current incarnation of Babs' show, presenting women's music every Thursday from 9 a.m. to noon. Hers is one of the few shows to also be simulcast on KZMU in Moab (the "Breakfast Jams" and Sunday's "Living the Circle of Life" are the only other ones).

Babs brings in all her own music, and has collected over three thousand CDs and vinyl records (remember those LPs?). She spends her own hard-earned cash on them, because she says that way she's not beholden to a label, and can tell her listeners what she really thinks of the music, good or bad.

She says that hosting her show on KRCL has become a permanent hobby and a creative outlet. Her favorite part of doing the show is meeting the challenge of staying current on all the new music, the history, and the current affairs she covers in her "women's news" segment. She insists she doesn't have a least favorite part. She does say, though, "I'm not always sure who's doing the show. It's completely a stream of consciousness, and sometimes I feel like I have no idea who's doing the show from week to week, or even if the electricity is on or if anyone's listening."

When she's not at KRCL, Babs sells real estate, a field she's been working in for twenty years. She's currently a principal broker with Urban Utah Homes and Estates, as well as a co-owner of the new women's sports bar, MoDiggity's. Her time at KRCL has increased her familiarity with women's music, which has come in handy as she books entertainment for the club.

"If we didn't have KRCL in this community," says Babs, "I'm not sure I'd live here." Given all the support shown KRCL by listeners and local businesses and organizations, clearly there are many folks in our community who agree with her!


KRCL Live Volume 4 Coming This Fall
