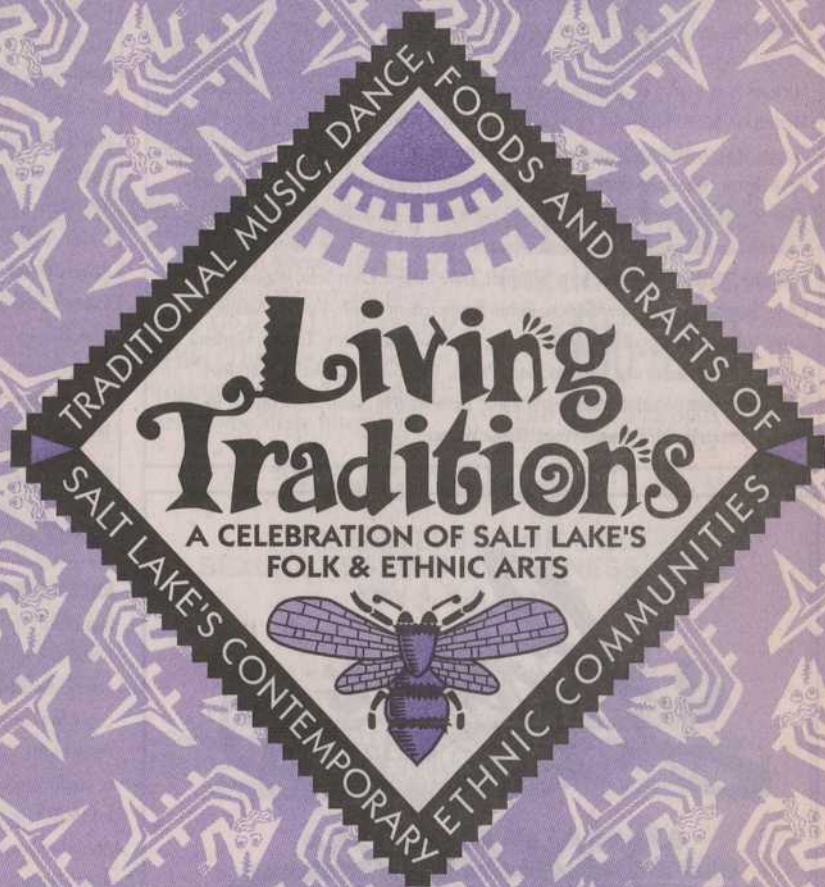

KRCL 91 FM and the Salt Lake City Arts Council invites you to attend the ninth annual Living Traditions Festival, May 20, 21, and 22 on the grounds of the Salt Lake City and County Building (450 S 200 E). This three-day event is free to the public and highlights the traditional music, dance, foods and crafts of more than forty ethnic communities that make Salt Lake Valley their home.

Features at this year's festival include two performance stages, located at the north and south ends of the City & Country Building, on which performances of traditional music and dance will be presented throughout the weekend. Some new groups to look for include Grupo Pampa performing music of Argentina, Vietnamese Lion Dancers and Maori dancers from the New Zealand Club. There is a crafts demonstration and display area, providing display space and workspace for 26 artisans to show and demonstrate their skills in making traditional crafts.

Traditional ethnic foods of their respective cultures will be featured and sold! All proceeds generated from food sales go to the community groups to support additional cultural programming. The Living Traditions Cantina offers, along



with traditional cantina beverages, a chance to relax in an informal outdoor bistro setting where performers will entertain and engage audiences with songs and sing-alongs.

Living Traditions opens Friday, May 20 at 5:00pm. Performances begin at 6pm, highlighted by a Native American Pow-wow organized by the Indian Walk Center. Special guest this year will be Poncho Sanchez and his nine-piece Latin band. Sanchez is regarded as one of the country's premier Latin band leaders and his style of salsa and Latin Jazz have earned praise and awards around the world. Poncho and his band will kick off the festival on Friday, May 20, at 8pm. In addition to the activities presented for the public, there is a special program just for school children from the Salt Lake school district. The Living Traditions brochure, with a complete schedule of the festival activities, will be available at the festival and can also be found as a special insert in the May 18th issue of Private Eye Weekly.

The Living Traditions Festival is produced by the Salt Lake City Arts Council and the Utah Arts Council Folk Arts Program. This year's sponsors include: KRCL 91FM, KUER FM 90, The Downtown Alliance, Pepsi Cola, United Colors of Benetton, Kennecott Corporation, US West.
