## It's a Tradition

It's gotten to be a tradition to go to the **Living Traditions Festival** every spring, and this year is no different. Living Traditions is a celebration of all the diversity in Utah (yes, there really is diversity in Utah!). It's the place you'll see Native American, Greek, or Thai dancers, hear Japanese drumming, Swiss yodelers, and Cajun tunes, and get a chance to sample interesting foods from around the world.

Living Traditions is at Washington Square, the park surrounding the City and County Building at Fourth South and State Street. It's all happening May 18<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup>, and 20<sup>th</sup>, and admission is free. There will be two stages with continuous dance and music, plus a workshop stage, and more entertainment in the beer garden. Approximately 600 artists from some forty Salt Lake Valley ethnic communities will come together to share their heritage. Festival hours are Friday 5–10 p.m., Saturday 12–10 p.m., and Sunday 12–7 p.m.

The new version of "Absolute Elsewhere" will air on Tuesday mornings, from 3:30–5:30 a.m. Check out "Breakfast of Champions", with hosts Alan and Ryan, on Wednesday mornings, 3:30–5:30 a.m.

Later on Tuesday, Lori is leaving "Tuesday Breakfast Jam", and is moving to "Sunday Sagebrush Serenade", where she'll share hosting duties with Phil. Now hosting "Tuesday Breakfast Jam" is Grant, who hosted "Nighthawks at the Diner" which aired early Sunday mornings.

Amazingly enough, Wednesday and Thursday are staying the same. Friday's co-host of "Susie & the Banshee", Matt, will be leaving that show to become the new host of "Across the Tracks", airing Saturdays from 1-4 p.m. And as we mentioned, Lori will be moving to Sunday Sage; she'll be taking Jodi's place as Jodi goes off in pursuit of world travels and a Ph.D.

## Not Just Another Day in the Week

When there's room in *Voices*, we'll take a look at a day of programming at KRCL. This time we'll be checking out Monday, the first day of the work week for many of you.

Mondays on KRCL begin with "Cranial Circuitry", hosted by Alan Moss. Alan's been with KRCL for many years, and brings a mix of industrial sounds to our airwaves from 1-3 a.m. He's currently followed by Brain, who started at KRCL as a volunteer phone-answerer. Brain will be taking his program, "Absolute Elsewhere", to Tuesday mornings, so keep an eye on *Voices* or KRCL's web page to see who's coming to this time slot next!

Monday continues with a half-hour public affairs program called "This Way Out." This nationally-produced and internationally-distributed program airs at 5:30 a.m., and covers news that affects the gay and lesbian community.

Then at 6 a.m. it's Monday Breakfast Jam, hosted by the Iceman, who also works as KRCL's volunteer music director. He'll bring you a mix of music, with an emphasis on Americana, contemporary singer-songwriters, and folk and folk-rock.

Following that, it's Sohrab, who brings you the calming sounds of "Prelude to Peace" from 9-11:30 a.m. Sohrab also hosts "Nexus" on Sunday nights. He's been with KRCL since the early 80's, when he used to appear as a guest host for Mark Jackman's show "Day Dreams."

At 11:30 a.m. weekdays, "Democracy Now" airs. This hour-long program covers news and developments

in our world. Host Amy Goodman is known for getting the story behind the headlines.

Monday afternoons feature one of KRCL's longest-running public affairs programs, "ArtSpeak." Over the years, this program has featured a variety of hosts, offering a half-hour discussion with visual artists, dancers, writers, theater artists, musicians, and others whose creative works entertain and inform our lives.

Then it's time for "Global Gumbo." This program airs Monday through Thursday from 1-3 p.m. On Mondays the host is Teri, who brings a mix of traditional and cutting edge sounds to her exploration of auditory geography.

Following Teri is "Monday Drive Time." Here's another show with a new host, Troy Mumm. While Troy may be new to this program, he's certainly not new to KRCL listeners, who are used to hearing him host "Across the Tracks" on Saturday afternoons. Troy also works as KRCL's Program Director. Be sure to check out his take on "Monday Drive."

"Pacifica News" rounds out the work day, bringing you a look at the day's news, Monday through Friday at 6 p.m. It's followed on Mondays by "The View from Here", an interview show hosted by KRCL's Public Affairs Director, Gena Edvalsen.

Next up is "Asian Chimes," an hour of music from the various corners of Asia. On Monday nights at 7 p.m., Uma, Pollavi, and Gopna bring you music from East India and the Indian Sub-Continent.

Monday nights on KRCL have long been the home of the blues. Continuing that tradition are J.R. and Truman, co-hosts of "Red, White, and Blues," which airs from 8-10:30 p.m. They'll bring you American blues ranging from old to new, rockabilly to jump styles, and even some cutting edge blues. If you're not sure what that means, tune in and find out!

Rounding out Monday night and bringing you more blues is Ziggy, host of "Crossroads," on from 10:30 p.m.-1 a.m. Ziggy enthusiastically brings you classic and contemporary blues from around the world, and artists you'll never hear anywhere else. His eastern European heritage allows him to find and share really unique music with you. Be sure to give a listen to "Blues from Poland" every Monday at midnight as part of this show.

And there you have it — twenty-four hours of great programming designed to start your week off right. Check out Mondays right here on KRCL.
